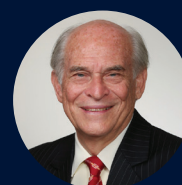

Major Road Works

**Hampstead Road,
Auburn**

This section of road carries a high volume of traffic and the road condition deteriorated, resulting in water ponding, kerb and gutter damage, cracked surfaces and potholes.

As part of rehabilitation works, the road pavement was excavated and asphalt was laid and compacted. Sections of damaged kerb were also reconstructed and the surface was finished with linemarking.



**Bombay Street,

The road surface along this section was showing defects. As part of pavement rehabilitation works the road was dug out, and sections of damaged kerb and gutter were reconstructed. Works included asphalt layer patching in areas of road that had a weak base. The section was then laid with fresh asphalt and linemarked.



Rawson Street, Auburn & Intersection Improvement with South Parade

This project was made up of two components (the asphalt roadway on Rawson Street from Northumberland Street to just west of the Railway bridge overpass; and restoring the asphalt surfacing of the bridge deck across the main western railway line). These works have been funded by RMS grant funds.

On Rawson Street, the road pavement had deteriorated causing ponding and potholes. The road surface has been finished with new line markings and raised pavement markers.

Works on the road surface on the railway overbridge were coordinated with state agencies, as the bridge structure is owned by Transport for NSW and the road surface is Council's asset.

The road pavement on the railway overbridge was in a state of disrepair, with road pavement lifting and causing a bumpy ride and posing a risk to trucks and utility vehicles.

The road surface has been finished with new line markings, raised pavement markers and new traffic light sensors.
