Composting and worm farming

Composting and worm farming are natural ways to recycle your organic garden and food waste. It is easy to start your own compost and worm farm at home, and Council can help make it even easier. Council can offer you some tools to help you get started with:

- A \$50 rebate for any compost bin or worm farm you buy (rebate is available to both home owners and tenants)
- FREE workshops on how to get started and trouble shooting tips
- Information about how to compost and worm farm

Why should you compost or worm farm?

- 50 per cent of waste generated at home is organic matter which can be recycled
- Composting and worm farming are cheap and easy ways to reduce your organic waste at home
- Composting returns vital nutrients back to the soil
- Castings and liquid fertiliser from worm farms are high in nutrients and add much needed nourishment back into the soil creating healthier plants and gardens
- Composting and worm farming is 100 per cent natural fertiliser so you don't have to buy expensive artificial chemical fertilisers

How do you compost or worm farm?

You need to decide if a compost bin or worm farm suits your needs. There are many types and sizes to suit your space.

Compost bins suit your needs if you have:

- A large number of people in your family
- A large garden
- Plenty of fresh fruit and vegetables scraps

Worm farms suit your needs if you have:

- A small garden or live in a unit or town house
- One or two people's worth of food scraps

Where do you get a compost bin or worm farm?

Hardware stores or garden centres sell compost bins, worm farms and worms.





To receive a \$50 rebate, simply buy your compost bin or worm farm from any retail outlet and follow the steps below:

- 1 Fill in and sign the attached form
- 2 Attach a copy of your receipt (it must include the date of purchase on it; it must be less than three months since you made purchase)
- **3** Attach proof of address which has both your full name and address on it (eg. copy of a rates bill, electricity bill or driver licence)
- **4** Return form to Council by one of the following ways:
